

Welcome to Goat Rock!

Goat Rock is a bush camping ground set on 200 acres of an 8000 acre property belonging to the Croft family. The Camping Ground is set amongst beautiful granite boulders and Moreton Bay Fig trees and is a lovely place to stay away from the crowds.



Facilities

- Goat Rock is open all year round and 24 hours a day. The camping ground is unmanned and whilst bookings are appreciated they are not necessary. An Honesty Tin is provided at the Information Stand for camping and day visitor fees and is checked daily.
- **ALL VISITORS must text/call Amanda on arrival on 0437 713 488 to confirm arrival and fill in registration form. Campers & day visitors!!**
- Camping sites are unmarked and allow visitors the freedom to choose a site that suits their specific requirements.
- There is no power to the camping grounds. Generators are allowed but please be considerate of fellow campers.
- Pit toilets are provided in a comfortable Toilet block.
- Shower cubicles with bucket showers are provided in the Shower block. A Hot Water Donkey is provided for hot water for showers.
- Wood BBQ's and Picnic facilities are provided for Day Visitors and Campers.
- Limited Firewood is provided for the BBQ's and Hot Water Donkey. BYO.
- Campfires are only permitted in the two designated fire rings. Fire drums are permitted in certain areas if you bring your own drum and firewood. (Fire drums must be fully contained ie base and sides)
- Firewood must **not** be gathered from the Camping Grounds.
- **Pets Welcome!** – Goat Rock is a part of a working sheep/cattle/goat property and pets need to be supervised at all times and restrained if necessary. Pets are NOT permitted at The Shed, our dining facility.
- **If you are unwell, please stay at home.**
- Practice physical distancing (1.5metres apart) and follow rules on gatherings.
- Access to sanitation products and running water cannot be guaranteed. We recommend bringing hand soap, hand wipes and toilet paper with you to maintain good hygiene as advised by the NSW Government. We cannot guarantee that visitor facilities (e.g. picnic tables, barbecues, toilets and other common touchpoints) are disinfected. It is your responsibility to wash your hands regularly and maintain good hygiene when using shared facilities. We recommend bringing your own sanitation products and additional drinking water.
- Please ensure to position your campsite a good distance from other groups.
- When using the shared facilities, including the toilets, shower block, bbq areas and shelter sheds, please ensure that socially distancing measures are in place and good hygiene practices are in place.
- We request those who are able to be self-contained do so to reduce the number of people using facilities

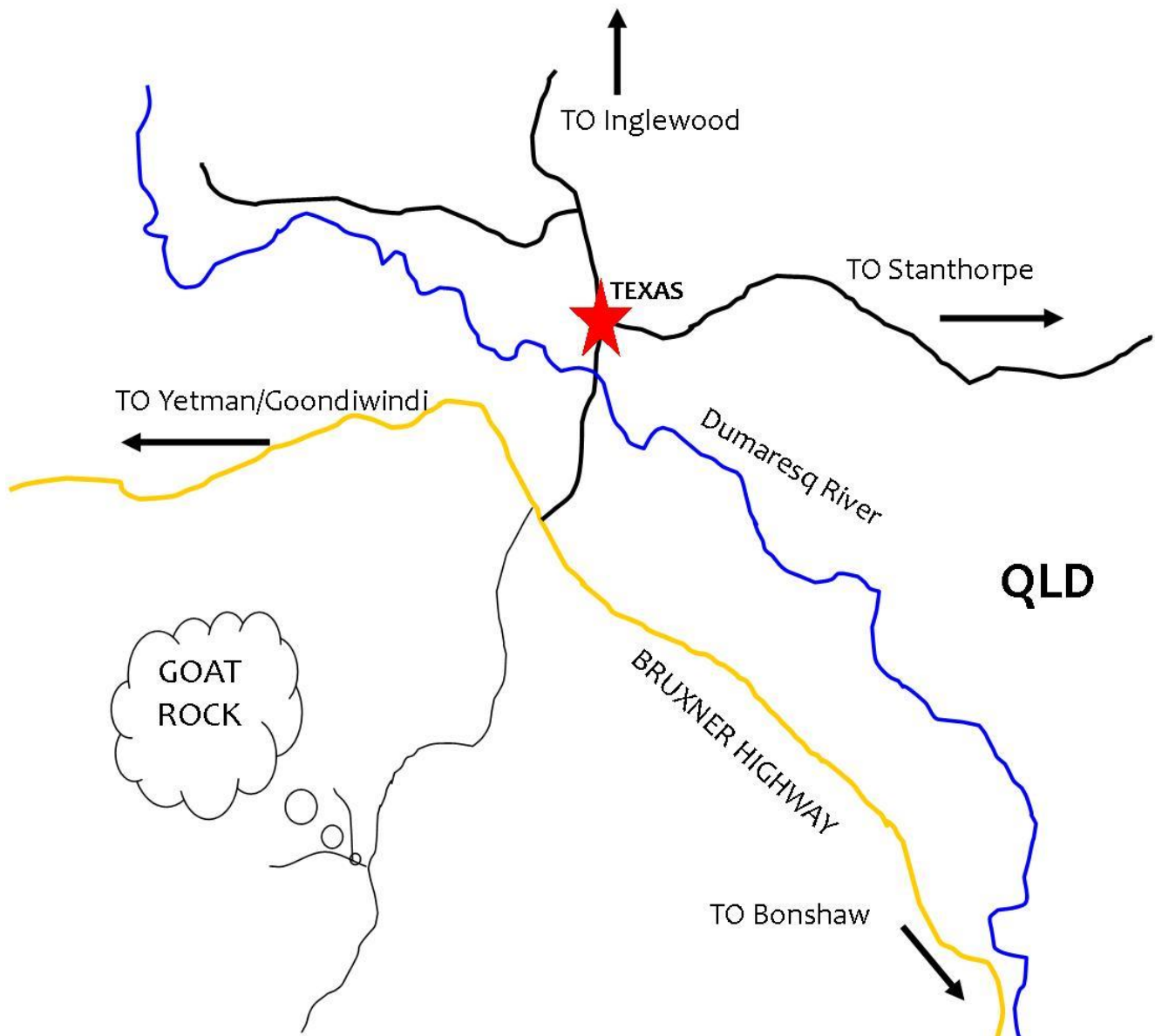

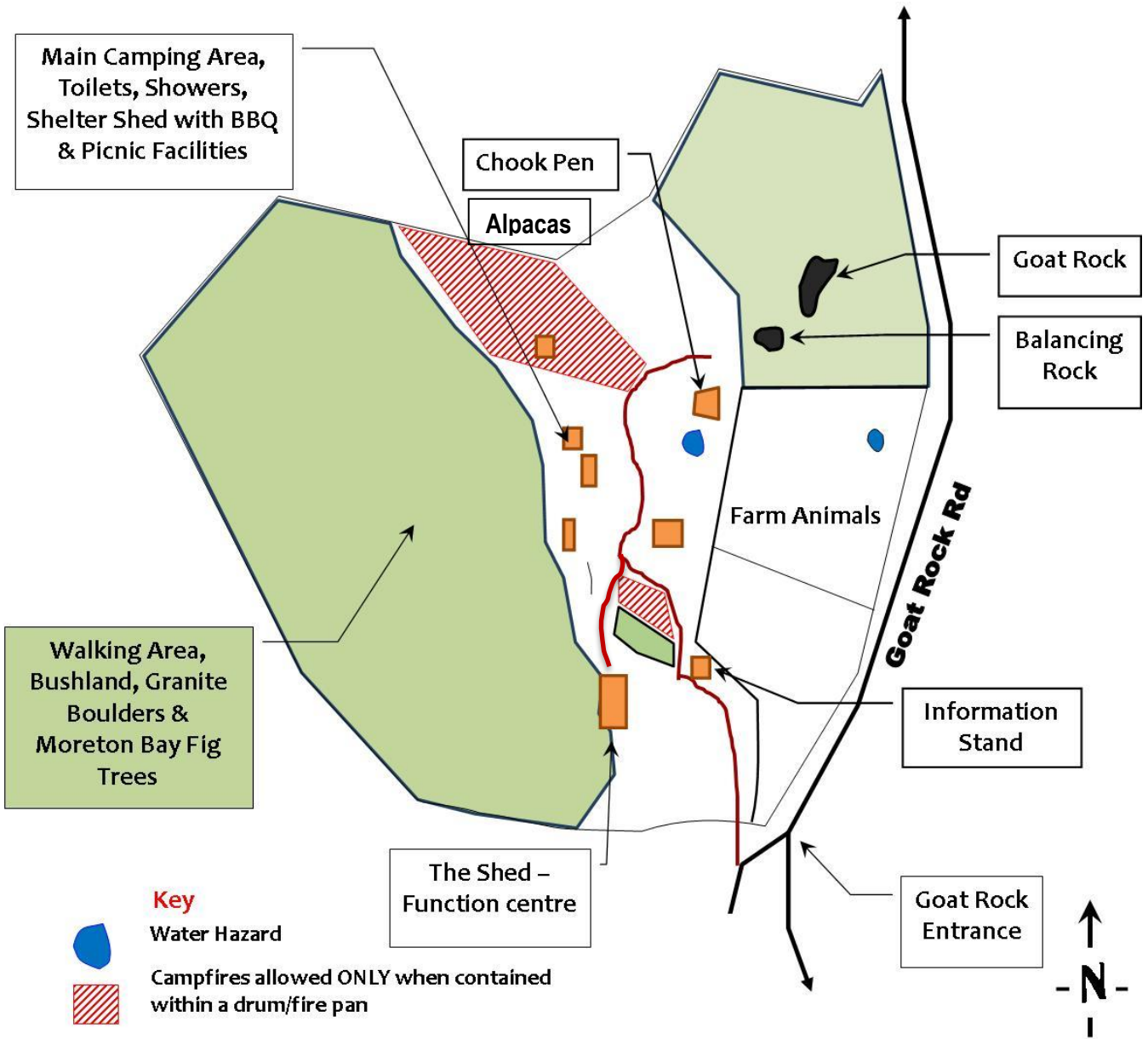
How to Find Us!



How to get to Goat Rock from Texas

Head south out of Texas towards the Bruxner Way. At the T-Intersection, turn to your right, after approx. 50 metres turn to your left onto Goat Rock Road. After 11km of dirt road turn to your right at the white wagon wheel and turn right again into Goat Rock. Follow the road and you will see the camping area, shower, toilet and picnic facilities.

**To assist with the smooth running of the
Goat Rock Camping Ground & Tourist Park, the following rules apply:**

- Please do not attach your campsite to a shelter shed or other structures – these are for everyone to use.
- Children must be supervised at all times.
- For the benefit of all visitors, noise should be kept to a minimum.
- Campsites and picnic areas must be kept clean. Garbage bins are provided, but you will need to bring rubbish bags.
- Dispose of any rubbish in the appropriate bins.
- Don't drop your cigarette butts anywhere but the appropriate bin.
- Ensure that you take everything that you bring to the campsite with you when you leave.
- If it doesn't burn don't put it in the fire pit.
- Try to leave everything as you found it. Don't disturb historic places, plants, animals or bushrock.
- Be sure to pick up all your pet's droppings.
- Be sure to use the appropriate toilet amenities.
- Never set up camp too close to another site - without asking their permission. The general, unwritten rule is two car spaces apart.
- Respect the local wildlife.
- Nets, traps, firearms, off road motorbikes are not permitted.
- Protect water supplies.
- Do not dispense grey or black water onto the ground. Take it out with you.
- Do not bury food scraps. They may be dug up and scattered by animals.
- Don't feed birds and animals around campsites or they may become pests. Unnatural food can be harmful to many species and they may become dependent on human provided food.
- Use a fuel stove where possible.
- Definitely don't build a ring of stones as a fireplace. There are two campfire rings at Goat Rock, near the two shelter sheds—please do not disassemble. Campfires are **only** allowed in the shaded area and when contained within a drum/fire pan.
- Firewood – Limited amounts available for Donkey and BBQ's. Please bring your own.
- Observe all fire bans.

Do not light fires:

- in hot, dry conditions,
- in dry windy weather, or
- when there is a declared fire ban
